

WRIGHT THINKING

This has been a traumatic summer. I've had to deal with several persons who were either new to orchids or new to the aspect of orchids under consideration. Normally, I love that, but somehow this time I thought most about the funny twists that have kept me interested in orchids for more than sixty years. Let me show you what I mean.

One of my new 'students' had made a cross using a very old stud plant and I felt required to caution that genetic crippling might make the cross less appealing than he hoped. He asked why and I told him because the background breeding contained infusions of both Lc. Grandee and Lc. Memoria Albert Heinecke. To put it gently, he hadn't a clue.

Lc. Grandee was registered by Armacost & Royston in 1937. It was a magnificent yellow with just one flaw: it had a bad case of the genetic abnormalities that plagued early yellows. Seemingly, the better the yellow flower the more profound the abnormality. Despite that risk, Sid Bracey couldn't leave something that good untested so he crossed Lc. Grandee 'Jules Furthman' with his namesake Lc. S. J. Bracey to make Lc. Memoria Albert Heinecke. The progeny was great – and greatly flawed. Albert Heinecke defeated every hybridizer who tried to establish a fine yellow-breeding strain. In time, the risk of deformed flowers grew too great and both Mem. Albert Heinecke and Grandee dropped from sight as parents and as cultivated plants.

So what we have left is Armacost & Royston, long since merged into Stewart Orchids, and Jules Furthman. Jules who? you say. Jules Furthman, proprietor of Furthman Orchids, Northwestern University alumnus, and writer of many things. As a young man, he graduated from newspapers and magazines to a toddling film industry. Like my family, and perhaps yours, he felt the pressure of anti-German sentiments in WW I and wrote for a time as Jules Grinnell, his middle name.

And what has all this to do with us - and orchids today? Jules Furthman was one of that golden group who made orchid magic for a time. With counterparts like Arthur Freed, Jules brought the tinsel world to our hobby. Jules did the screenplay for *Mutiny on the Bounty* that starred Charles Laughton; Raymond Chandler's *The Big Sleep; To Have and Have Not* – the one where Lauren Bacall instructed Humphrey Bogart on how to whistle.

Jules kept writing fine movies on down near our day, and some of you may remember his *Rio Bravo*, directed by Howard Hawks and starring John Wayne, Dean Martin, Ricky Nelson, Angie Dickson, Walter Brennan, Ward Bond, Pedro Gonzales-Gonzales – the list might be longer but we ran out of marquee. Toward the end of Jules' career, he did another John Wayne thing, *Jet Pilot* co-starring Janet Leigh.
