To All Members:

To All SWROGA Members,

The final meeting of my term of office will be March 31 to April 2 in Wichita Falls, Texas. I have some fond memories of several shows there and am looking forward to this one.

We have been approached to set up in SWROGA a relief committee to help SWROGA victims of our two hurricanes by replacing uninsured orchid plants lost to the storms. MINUTES of the 89th SWROGA DIRECTORS and MEMBERS FALL 2005 MEETING

Saturday, November 5, 2005, at the Wyndham Riverfront Hotel, Little Rock, Arkansas

Hosted by the ARKANSAS ORCHID SOCIETY

President Lloyd Burns called the semi-annual Fall 2005 SWROGA meeting to order promptly at 10:32 am. Following assurance from Registrar Billie Beck Kramer that a quorum was met, President Burns addressed the Members and Directors and thanked the Arkansas Orchid Society for being a very fine host and saving the beautiful tree color until the weekend of the Show.

The Minutes of the 88th SWROGA Spring meeting were approved as printed in the Summer 2005 SWROGA NEWS, Vol. 37, Issue 2.

Treasurer, Carolyn McCabe, summarized the SWROGA Semi-Annual Financial Report for the period ending September 30, 2005, a copy of which is attached to and made a part of these Minutes. As of 9/30/05 the account total was \$80,010.26 showing an increase of \$4,850.50 since the last report for 3/31/05. Carolyn assured the Members that there was no limit for a 501(c)3 organization but \$25,000 in income does require IRS reporting. The Treasurer's Report was approved and filed. The Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year ending 9/30/06 was presented with questions taken by the President. Patsy Boersma will coordinate the Education Expense with Clyde Holt. The Budget for 2006 was approved and filed and is a part of these Minutes.

President Burns called for the Reports of the Standing committees.

In the absence of Steve Eagle, Maureen Ferrara reported for Affiliated Societies that the 90th Spring 2006 Meeting and Show will be hosted by the Red River Orchid Society at the Remington Hotel, Wichita Falls, Texas, on March 31 through April 2, 2006. Contact Chair is M.C. Porter. The Greater North Texas OS will host the AOS/SWROGA meeting for Spring 2007 and Greater New Orleans will host Spring 2008. Today, approval is being requested by Heart O' Texas to host the Fall '06 Show. Houston has received a date approval for the Spring '09 Show from AOS, per Mavis Klehm. Fall '07, '08, and '09 is open. Today's Raffle raised \$245 for the Research Fund. Report approved and filed.

Byron McGraw, Chair of the Bylaws and Judiciary Committee, with all Members present, reported discussing a number of issues but no suggestions or action of the Committee was taken at this time. Report filed.

In the absence of Jim Williams, there was no Conservation report.

Patsy Boersma, with 2 members present reported for the Programs and Education Committee that the Speakers List has been updated and reminded Members that the List of Speakers and Slides is in the SWROGA Directory. Our librarian, Betty Kurka, is the contact person for Slide Shows. Slide Shows are usually made by the Members and are donated to SWROGA for rental. Few are used. Olie Garrison will take a few of the Shows and scan them and put them on CDs and see how it works. Lena mentioned that the Judging Center is getting good slides. A question was presented as to who approves a Slide Show or CD or DVD? Patsy responded that the Programs Committee members can review and approve the presentations, but warned that any copy written material should have prior written approval before use. The report was approved and filed.

The Chair of the Show Committee, Lowell McCabe reported that they have a new member, Karleen Sanborn. \$525 was collected for show tags in FY 2005 with a cost of \$62.70 for mailing them. The Committee is working on a PDF file of the Show Schedule. Report was approved and filed.

Publications Chair Amanda Saar reported four members present with a visitor, Byron. Amanda was happy to report that ads in the SWROGA NEWS have increased (for no known reason). Deadline for next issue is December 2, 2005. We now have an official Webmaster, Manny Aybar, who has a lot of exciting ideas for redesigning our Website! In 2006 Members will be invited to join a News Group. Whether you receive your NEWS by e-mail or snail-mail there will be a link to PDF reader on Website. Upcoming articles in the NEWS will include (but not be limited to!) an article by Manny, *Benefits of SWROGA Membership*, by Byron, *Proper Lighting at SWROGA Judging*, and by Amanda, *SACRO, a Conservation Effort in Costa Rica*. For \$25/year commercial vendors can have a link on the SWROGA website, but if they do a full-page ad for one year the link will be free. There will also be a free link for a Society's website. Report accepted and filed.

Dick Jamison, Chair of the Research Committee, reported that the Committee has received the comments of the SWROGA Bylaws and Judiciary Committee relating to the SWROGA Research Fund Procedures. The Research Committee is appreciative of the efforts of the BJC. Most of the suggested changes are minor in syntax, wording and grammar. The document is now greatly improved. There was a substantive change suggested: that monies donated to SWROGA for directed grants be disbursed to the designated recipient after the approval of the Research Committee and the Continuing Operating Committee. The Research Committee supports this change. Report was approved by Members and filed.

Michael Saar, as current President-Elect, does not need to be nominated. He will serve as President beginning Spring 2006. Report was accepted as presented and filed.

Betty Kurka, Historian, reported *in absentia*, that a new comprehensive list is now available of all past Presidents of SWROGA, including '62 through '77, for publication. A copy is attached to these Minutes. It is noted that extra copies of the *SWROGA Directory* cost \$5.

Billie Beck Kramer made a motion to set aside \$500 to help replace greenhouses of SWROGA Members devastated by hurricane Katrina. Motion died due to lack of second.

Lena moved to setup an ad hoc committee of perhaps five Members to determine a preliminary need for assistance in reestablishing plants for those lost as victims of hurricane Katrina in the southern Louisiana area. After much discussion regarding need and the determination thereof, specifically earmarked donations, applications of need, and funding, the motion was amended to set-up a committee which would establish guidelines for the providing of assistance to Members in need of plant replacement as a result of hurricane devastation. The motion to establish the ad hoc committee was seconded and passed by the Directors. The committee will report at the Spring '06 meeting.

Wally Boersma, SWROGA official auditor, reported that the fiscal books look great and are in good order. Motion was made to approve report. Seconded and approved by Directors.

Al Taylor proposed that proceeds of this Fall's Auction be directed to a Hurricane Victims' Fund rather than the Research Fund as had previously been approved by the Directors. Much discussion ensued. Byron suggested leaving the proceeds earmarked as is even though the Research Committee has no grant applications at this time although they are ready to accept SWROGA funds. Dick would have no objections to a funding change. A motion was made and seconded to apply this Fall's auction proceeds to a Hurricane Victims' Fund and use next Spring's auction funds to support the Research Fund. The motion failed to carry the votes of the Directors and was not approved.

Meeting adjourned at 11:45 am.

Night and Day

Byron McGraw

Did you ever look at your Orchids at night in your greenhouse? If your greenhouse is like mine, it has fluorescent lights. These are fairly bright lights and things are easy to see but the flowers are dull. The color just doesn't seem as vivid as when you looked at them earlier in the day when the sun was shining. Daylight really enhances the color of the flowers. We always want to see our orchids at their best, therefore we need good light. Fluorescent lights may be fine for the greenhouse but not for judging.




SWROGA shows are judged at night. This is necessary as the Saturday morning is taken up with Committee meetings, Directors meetings and the General meeting leaving no time for the judging of the show. This means your flowers do not get the proper consideration. Several years ago the Directors recognized this problem and placed the requirement that a light corrected for daylight be made available at each SWROGA Show. Specifications were developed in order that the light could be made available. To my knowledge two of this apparatus was made by SWROGA members. Both of these were clumsy, heavy and were rarely used. Finally, it seems that most societies hosting the show just ignored the requirement, thus denying the members whose orchids were pulled for AOS Judging the possibility of being seen at their best. Some societies today like to have their regular show judged at night..


Today we have such a light available, providing the daylight wide spectrum, at your local retail store or they may be ordered from several catalog sources at very reasonable prices. If your society is still using standard incandescent bulbs or traditional fluorescent bulbs for judging, you are not providing the proper light for the show plants to be judged. Not only do these lights provide daylight but additional brightness to allow the Judge to see the correct color, texture and the flower details.

Recently at a judging, even though it was during the day, the cloudy weather did not allow the Judges to see the actual color. Fortunately, a daylight lamp providing this wide spectrum light was available. The Judges used this light and the flower received an Award of Merit, whereas it probably would have only received a High Class Certificate. If your society is planning a show in which the judging will occur at night, please visit a retailer of lamps in your area and consider buying one of these lamps. You will be amazed at the results as well as the price. Help turn the Orchid Judging from **Night to Day**.

SACRO, a nonprofit organization set up to save Costa Rican orchids, has several goals, but the most interesting is that of saving the Guardia Morada, Costa Rica’s national flower, also known as *Guarianthe skinneri*, using educational and informational activities primarily among school children.

Another goal is that of plant rescue by collaborating with orchid gardens through the country to rescue species from fallen trees and re-establish them on trees in orchid gardens, and a third is to encourage propagation of orchid seeds in the laboratories of public and private organizations, and then offering plants to local and international collectors at excellent prices, and therefore discouraging the indiscriminate extraction of orchids from Costa Rica.

SACRO membership only costs \$25 a year, and for that donation you receive a CD with pictures and descriptions of the ongoing projects supported by SACRO.
