WHAT'S IN A NAME? By Glenda McIntosh

Galeottia burkei (Reich.f.) (Garay) Dressler & Christenson

Tribe: Maxillarieae Subtribe: Zygopetalinae Genus: Galeottia

Galeottia burkei (Reich.f.) (Garay) Dressler & Christenson

Pronunciation: gal-e-OT-ee-ah BURK-ee-eye


Meaning of name: The genus name honors Henri Galeotti, an Italian botanist who explored Mexico in the 19th century. The species name honors David Burke, the Englishman who collected orchids for Veitch & Sons throughout South America during the 19th century.

Synonyms: Zygopetalum burkei, Zygo.prainianum, Mendoncella burkei.

Habitat: Brazil, Peru, Venezuela, Guyana, and Surinam growing as a terrestrial up to 2200 m. Other *Galeottia* species grow as epiphytes in moist forests from 300 m. upward in the same area, and also in Mexico.


Taxonomy: The name of this genus was originally *Galeottia* when published by Achille Richard and Henri Galeotti in 1845. It was switched to *Mendonsella* by A. D. Hawkes in 1963, after he discovered that the name *Galeottia* had been used incorrectly because in 1844 Ruprecht named a genus of grasses by the same name. At that time, it was illegal to give a genus of plants a name that was already in use for another plant genus. The name *Galeottia* was back in favor when Alec Pridgeon published *The Illustrated Encylopaedia of Orchids* in 1992. Obviously, the International Code of Botanical Nomenclature had made a change to the previous rule.

At the time that Hawkes renamed the *Galeottias*, he wanted to honor Dr. Luys de Mendonça e Silva who was the editor of *Orquieda*.



The average orchid grower is so busy with his growing collection of orchids, that he does not have time to read the journal published by the ICBN every four years, nor prestigious foreign orchid journals dedicated to nomenclatural changes. The grower does not have time to be change nametags frequently. So it is only when the grower receives an American Orchid Society Award that these rules become important to him and a change is made to the original nametag!

Description: Galeottia burkei is a terrestrial species growing in boggy, acid soils. The pseudobulbs are narrow with 2-3 erect, tough, oblanceolate, acute to acuminate, petiolate leaves 30-45 cm long. The inflorescence is racemose, about 60 cm tall, with up to 6 fleshy flowers. Flowers are variable in color intensity, green with heavy brown marks on sepals and petals, very similar to Galeottia jorisiana. The lip is white and the basal crest is heavy, with many points, white with some red-purple marks. The anther cap is yellow with a red rostellum. Both sepals and petals are lanceolate, acuminate. Lip is 3-lobed at the base, pubescent on margins of the midlobe, acuminate, erose on the front margin, fimbriate; callus is several-ridged, fleshy, broad across the base of the midlobe.
