## WHAT'S IN A NAME? By Glenda McIntosh


Tribe: Epidendreae Subtribe: Laeliinae Genus: Pollardia

**Pollardia ghiesbreghtiana** (A. Richard & Galeotti) Withner & Harding, comb.

**Pronunciation:** pol-LARD-ee-ah geeze-breg-ti-AH-nah.

**Basionym:** Epidendrum ghiesbreghtianum A. Richard & Galeotti, 1845.

**Synonyms:** Encyclia ghiesbreghtiana (A. Richard & Galeotti) Dressler., Hormidium ghiesbreghtianum (A. Richard & Galeotti) Brieger., Prosthechea ghiesbreghtiana (A. Richard & Galeotti) W. E. Higgins.



**Derivation of Name:** The genus name honors Glenn E. Pollard who has done extensive work with Mexican orchids and whose book *The Genus Encyclia in Mexico* (1974) co-authored with Robert Dressler provided so much information for Carl L. Withner and Patricia Harding in their revision of Encyclia/Epidendrum. The species name honors Auguste Boniface Ghiesbreght, a famous 19<sup>th</sup> century collector of Mexican plants.

**Taxonomy:** The genus Pollardia is characterized by (1) a lip partially attached to the column, (2) resupinate flowers that come from a sheath, and (3) column teeth equal or subequal in length and generally the same size. The resupinate flowers separate this genus from Anacheilium and the equal length column teeth separate it from Prosthechea. This species is similar to *Pollardia hastata* but *P. hastata* is smaller and has pseudobulbs with only one leaf. This species, like *hastata*, sometmes has lateral lobes of the lip developed as projecting angles at the base of the lip.

Description: Plant almost a miniature, but produces flowers large for its size. Pseudobulbs clustered, ovoid or ellipsoid, 2-6.5 cm long, 0.5-2.4 cm wide. Leaves 2-3, ligulate-elliptic, acute or obtuse, 6-20 cm long, 0.7-1.3 cm wide. Inflorescence from within bases of leaves, a short stem rises often with a basal sheath 4-12 cm long, with 1-3 blooms. Sepals and petals pale green, densely spotted, or streaked with brown (or maroon), reverse side olivaceous). Lip white, with a few short purple veins near base, Column green with brown spots. Sepals lanceolate, acute, 15-24 mm long, 3-8.5 mm wide. Petals elliptic, acute, 14-22 mm long, 3-6 mm wide. Lip basally adnate to the column unlobed to 3-lobed (if lateral lobes present, they are very small), blade subquadrate-orbicular, the base cuneate to truncate, retuse, 16-27 mm long, 16-30 mm wide, callus oblong, running into three fleshy veins which run to near the margin. Column stout, 5-6.5 mm long, the teeth obtuse, subequal.

Habitat and Distribution: Mexico. Found at 2000-2700 m. elevation, in pine-oak forests, seasonally rather wet

Flowering time: February to May.

**Culture:** This species prefers intermediate to warm temperatures with a pronounced seasonal (winter) dry period.

## WRIGHT THINKING

We had some recent update information about the SWROGA official orchid, *Hexalectris warnockii*. Early references in our files came from the monumental Ames-Correll cataloging of Southwestern orchids. Not so long after this reference was published, orchid enthusiasts in the El Paso area ventured into nearby mountains and obtained information about a small community of the orchid there. Unfortunately, the site was not precisely located, and what little is known of the expedition has been shrouded in secrecy to preserve the stand from 'collectors' of any persuasion.

Quite recently, several responsible orchid people have reported sightings of *warnockii* and even pictures of them *in situ*. The fine work of the Liggios has set a very high standard for this type of documentation. One can only hope that additional current data will be published in a vehicle that can catalog and preserve it.

My arthritic old bones do not favorably entertain thoughts of going personally into sites for *Survival* reality shows, but I would like to share with the more agile and intrepid a few thoughts about where is where and what is what.

Through the miracle of pocket-size GPS units, hikers and other explorers can locate themselves very precisely. In my day, we didn't need a doodad to tell us we were lost, but I can see the value of one that will tell us HOW lost we really are. This same information, however, can also pinpoint the locale of our *in situ* observations. Not only can we secure conjunctions of longitude and latitude, we can transfer these to a variety of maps.

One really neat source for an enormous variety of maps – many free for the downloading – is the United States Geological Survey site. A good place to start is: <a href="http://www.usgs.gov/pubprod/maps.html">http://www.usgs.gov/pubprod/maps.html</a> where one may find a map for just about any place the imagination can conjure. Many of these references include topographical maps and even inter-active maps that can interpret those funny GPS numbers with great precision. A brief satellite interrogation and a careful noting of the response will pinpoint an observation site within a few feet.

Some digital cameras accept an adapter that will enter GPS location data on the shot history that accompanies digital picture downloads. This provides a precise double check of location, and adds date, time and photographic settings data in surprising detail. In short, when you observe, also record. This will assist in authentication of the sighting and will permit other observers to confirm your findings.
