Welcome all to SWROGA! Do you know how widespread an area this Association covers? We include orchid societies from Arkansas, Kansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and Texas with 27 societies represented. Each person is also a member of SWROGA if their society belongs to SWROGA, which at last count we're about 800 individuals. And, SWROGA provides meeting resources for member societies. We have an extensive library of over 30 PowerPoint programs covering a wide range of orchid subjects. These can be obtained from Carolyn McCabe. We also maintain a list of potential speakers. Thanks to the Central East Texas Orchid Society for hosting our Spring 2015 SWROGA meeting. Keri Branch, Jean Brewton, Jake Massey, Naomi Marksbury and their many helpers did a great job. Their theme 'Carnival of Orchids' resulted in many creative interpretations in the displays. The event ran smoothly and we hope they can see the light and host us again in the near future. The azaleas were not in full bloom due to the cold winter and spring. Also we had no rose flowers at the Tyler Rose Center, the show location, again due to the cold weather.

Now we move on to Fort Worth for the Fall 2015 SWROGA meeting. Their event will be October 23-25, 2015 at the Ft. Worth Botanic Garden. The board has also approved Oklahoma City for spring 2016, on May 6-8, which is Mother's Day Weekend. During our meeting we discussed Shreveport hosting for our fall 2016, and Baton Rouge hosting for our spring 2017 meetings. We plan to approve those two shows in Ft. Worth.

A nominating committee was formed at the Tyler meeting as required in the by-laws. They are to report a slate of officers consisting of President Elect, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Editor, and Member-at-large for the continuing operating committee. Jake Massey

ORCHID SHOW RANDOM THOUGHTS JOHN STUBBINGS, SWROGA PRESIDENT

Goodness! We have been attending orchid shows since 1979! Our first venture into orchids was to a Mid-America Orchid Congress (the northern version of SWROGA) near Cleveland, Ohio. What has impressed me throughout these years is the dedication of everyone involved with these shows. That includes the host society organizers, the exhibitors, the speakers, and the vendors. At first, I was unaware of the judging part of shows, or the training for judges. People from all walks of life and backgrounds come together for a few days away from home just to be with orchids and friends. Many spend the whole weekend or more at the show and the surrounding area. No sports events are included on those weekends. (Well, no sporting event except for the mad dash races by customers to an international vendor when they start unpacking their goodies!)

We have gone to more regional shows like SWROGA and Mid-America than I can remember. Each region has its own rules, organization, entry schedule, and expectations. Each region has its own meetings and lecture schedules also. Many AOS judges participate in the show and ribbon judging in these two regions. In other parts of the country, much of the ribbon and trophy judging is not done by the AOS judges, but rather by the local society experts.

Every show has some wonderful memories attached to it.

We have also gone to many National Shows. These are in conjunction with AOS members and Directors meetings. These last longer starting on a Wednesday and running through Sunday. These usually include banquets, preview parties, international vendors, international lecturers, and auctions. Live auctions at these AOS functions raise thousands of dollars, sometimes thousands for the same man's tie more than once in the evening! There are also fantastic plants at these auctions. We frequently donate items for the AOS, SWROGA and Mid-America auctions. We have bid successfully on a few items but none of the outrageous ones (outrageous prices).

So why do we go to so many shows – about 10 per year? Because they are fun! Sandy and I have met lots of wonderful people through participating in these shows. We also have traveled much of the country and added some great sightseeing to our orchid trips. This is

true in the United States and out of the country. So we recommend highly active participation in your local show. You will learn a lot and develop many new friends.

SWROGA ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

This is to explain an honor you may or may not be fully familiar with, the SWROGA Achievement Award. This award was created subsequent to the efforts of an ad hoc committee chaired by Lena Parker in 1992. The purpose of the award is to recognize extraordinary members and their efforts in behalf of SWROGA.

Conditions and procedures are that any member can nominate a potential recipient (living or deceased). Nominations are made by letter to the SWROGA President, and should list the nominee's accomplishments. The letter must be received by the Continuing Operating Committee at least 60 days prior to the next meeting to be considered. The letter is then circulated to SWROGA officers for their recommendation. If recommended by the officers, the nomination is presented to the Board of Directors for approval, to be presented as soon as possible.

SOUTHWEST REGIONAL ORCHID GROWERS ASSOCIATION 108TH DIRECTORS AND MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES MARCH 27, 2015

The SWROGA Directors and Membership meeting was held at the Tyler Rose Garden Center, Tyler, Texas on Friday, March 27, 2015. President John Stubbings called the meeting to order at 8:13 p.m. Carolyn McCabe reported a quorum present with 12 societies represented.

President John Stubbings introduced the other officers: Vice-president, Jake Massey; Secretary, Ray Nell Massey; Treasurer, Carolyn McCabe; President-elect, Mary Mancini; Editor, Rex Ulmer (not present); and Member-at-large, Patsy Boersma.

The minutes of the previous meeting were posted in the newsletter and on the website; there were no additions or corrections. A motion by Earl Gambell, and second by Don Maples to approve the minutes as published, was made. The motion carried.

TREASURERS REPORT

Carolyn McCabe passed out the report to all present. She reviewed the Annual Financial Report. The Inflows and outflows for the three accounts—General Funds, Research, and Trophies—were itemized. The total as of March 27, 2015 for all three was \$126,572.64. A motion by Earl Gambell, and seconded by Jake Massey that the Annual Financial Report be approved, was made. The motion carried.

There was a discussion about the proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2015 (which is from October 1 through September 30, 2016). It was agreed to postpone the discussion until the end of all committee reports.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Conservation Committee

Charles Hess reported that the goals of the Conservation committee were continuing unchanged with the primary focus of supporting the efforts of the North American Orchid Conservation Center (NAOCC) through the Smithsonian Environmental Research Center.

At the last membership meeting, we voted to give \$1,000 to support the American Orchid Conservation Center. The motion to again fund this effort with a new \$1,000 donation, however, did not carry. The main concern was two-fold: 1) Specific programs this funding would support could not be easily identified, and 2) It was suggested that the individual societies get more involved with the funding effort.

A motion was made that the motion to donate \$1,000 be tabled until next meeting to have time to get more financial information. This motion carried.

Prior funding donations from SWROGA helped complete the GO ORCHIDS website of the NAOCC as the balance of information on the remaining orchid species in Texas came online this spring.

Fundraising from conservation ticket raffles held at various orchid shows have proven to still be able to fund conservation efforts of the Rainforest Trust, the Orchid Conservation Alliance, and the NAOCC. The NAOCC programs are the only ones aligned with the Conservation Committee, but the Rainforest Trust and the Conservation Alliance have the strongest appeal to the general public and the urgency is more visible. The efforts of the orchid show host society to bring in visitors have been key to this success.

Charles also reported that the goal to get a conservation newsletter to each society had not gotten off the ground.

Though not reported at the general meeting, the Conservation Committee that met earlier addressed the need to reach out to a wider community beyond just the orchid societies to identify conservation efforts. Very helpful was Jim Williams's recount of his efforts and experiences as Chair of the Committee with suggestions as to who we could consider contacting.

To recap Section III, Article V, Section 7: The Conservation Committee shall work toward location, identification, and preservation of local orchids, and work with other organizations toward conservation of native orchids.

Affiliated Societies Committee

Lena Parker had 6 committee members present. _The future shows were discussed. The hosts are Autumn of 2015—Fort Worth; Spring of 2016—Oklahoma City; Autumn of 2016—Shreveport (pending); Spring of 2017—Baton Rouge (pending).

Shreveport and Baton Rouge are not approved yet because neither had officially asked for a show. In order to get considered, the society must send a letter to the president agreeing that SWROGA will not be required to assume any liability, that the society will assume all

liability for the show. Both are in the schedule, and both will be approved at the next meeting. Fort Worth was approved for the fall of 2015.

Lena asked the members to ask their society to host a show.

Lena announced that the silent auction and regular auction have changes in the show schedule.

Program and Education (and Show Tags) Committee

Lowell McCabe—There are 37 SWORGA Orchid (power point) programs on CDs. The list is on the web site.

Publications Committee

There is no report at this time.

Show committee

Don Maples—The committee met with 4 members and 3 guests present. The committee discussed that we need to collect data from each show. The show chair can download a spreadsheet from SWORGA that can be completed with the show data, like how many of each kind of plant entered, and other information. The spreadsheet will be posted on the SWROGA web site with the other show information.

The date for the Fort Worth show is October 24, 2015.

Lena mentioned that we had an entry for a dendrobium not on the list for 2013. SWROGA needs a new plant list. Lena requested a new plant entry list.

Remember to send your show flyers to Rex Ulmer (rexorchids@gmail.com) for the newsletter, which has to be received 6 weeks before the next biannual SWROGA show.

Research Committee

Richard Jamison—We have received a research grant proposal entitled "Phyogenic analysis of the Orhidacea Genus Gongora based on Four Barcode Regions" from Olivia Rodriquez, et al of the University of St. Thomas, Department of Biology, Houston, Texas. After due consideration and contact with the principle author and her faculty advisor (Alexandra Simmons Ph.D.), we recommend funding of this proposal in the amount of \$2,500.

A motion to fund the proposal in the amount of \$2,500, "Phylogenic Analysis of the Orchidacea Genus Gongora Based on Four Barcode Regions" by Olivia Rodriquez el al, University of St. Thomas, Houston, Texas, was made. The motion was seconded, and the motion carried.

We recommend the payment of the money be withheld pending satisfactory conclusion of administrative details between the University of St. Thomas and SWROGA (represented by

Richard M. Jamison, Ph.D., Chairman of the Research Committee). Upon notice from Dr. Jamison, the Treasurer of SWROGA will forward the funds to the appropriate official of the University of St. Thomas, Houston, Texas.

So, there was a motion to withhold funding of the approved proposal "Phylogenic Analysis of the Orchidacea Genus Gongora Based on Four Barcode Regions" pending satisfactory conclusion of administrative details by the University of St. Thomas, Houston, Texas and the SWROGA. This motion was seconded, and the motion carried.

Bylaws & Judiciary Committee

No Report

Audit Committee

The Audit Committee submitted a letter stating that the finances of SWROGA had been audited and no exceptions to general accounting practices or procedures were found. The Audit Committee praised the Treasurer for well-kept records.

Budget for Fiscal Year 2015 (October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2015):

Carolyn McCabe reviewed the proposed Budget for FY 2015. There was a motion to move \$1,000 from the Trophy fund to Operating Fund to pay for conservation contributions. The motion received a second, but motion failed.

There was a motion to approve the revised budget as amended and as over-budget was made and seconded. The motion carried.

President Stubbings asked for volunteers for the nominating committee for all offices except the President-elect, and to include the member at large. Members volunteering for the Nominating Committee were Charles Hess, Jake Massey, and Sandy Stubbings.

SWROGA Achievement Award:

Lena Parker was awarded the SWROGA Achievement Award in appreciation for her outstanding service as a dedicated supporter of SWROGA, the Shreveport Orchid Society, the Dallas Judging Center, the Shreveport Judging Center, the AOS, and for the significant contributions she has made to both SWROGA and the orchid community.






